# **SAPSA Update**



#### "Compounding Your Career" - Careers night: 23/08/21


What the event was about: To provide an informative and educational evening which explored all branches of careers in pharmacy including industry, hospital, community, and research.

The National Association of Pharmacy Students of Australia (NAPSA) has developed this student-led journal, through which Australian pharmacy students will have exclusive access to publish their work and have the opportunity to participate in reviewing other students' submissions. The APSJ is the only peer-reviewed pharmacy student journal in the world. Our purpose is to facilitate the work that students conduct in the research sector and project it into the industry.

#### WHY STUDENT-LED RESEARCH?


Research is a key area that many pharmacy bodies have identified as an area that needs to be developed in the pharmacy profession and by targeting this development at a student level, we can foster essential research skills and create a research culture that will positively impact the future of the pharmacy profession. One of the domains in the National Competency Framework 2016 focuses specifically on education and research. It is an expectation of all pharmacists to be able to evaluate current evidence and apply it to their practice. Hospitals in Australia are now investing in their pharmacy departments to conduct research, which drives clinical practice, quality use of medicines, funding and overall enhances the quality of healthcare in Australia.

The opportunities for student-led research in pharmacy are widespread, with all accredited Australian undergraduate pharmacy programs offering an integrated honours stream. Research is an avenue where students can improve written communication abilities, critical analysis and problem-solving skills within a team environment. It is these skills that are essential and will stand out to future pharmacy employers regardless of field.

#### **ABOUT THE JOURNAL**

The APSJ aims to:

- Strengthen the quality of student-led research in the pharmacy industry of Australia
- Provide a platform for students to publish their research in a peer-reviewed journal
- Promote the importance of student-led research within the profession
- Encourage evidence-based practice and stimulate research culture
- Develop skills of critical analysis under the supervision of an academic mentor
- Provide opportunities for students and early career pharmacists to gain skills and experience in academic publishing



# Introducing the APSJ

The journal accepts submissions from students currently studying pharmacy, undertaking an internship or early career pharmacist who have completed their research during their studies. Research in which an academic has supported a student, however a student must have led the research and been the main author.

The Journal accepts submissions in the form of:

- Original Research Article
- Academic Review Article
- Case Reports
- Academic viewpoint
- Feature articles
- Opinion pieces
- Qualitative Research

The journal is published bi-annually, with the first edition due to be released in January 2022. The APSJ is an open access journal that is indexed to ensure authors' work is projected into the research pool. # Pharmacy Awareness Chair

Hi everyone, my name is Ellen (Ah Dam) Jeon, and I am the new NAPSA Pharmacy Awareness Chair for 2021/2022. I am from the Charles Sturt University Orange campus, and I was president of the Orange Pharmacy Students Association for the academic year 2020/2021.

We launched a vaccine-preventable disease awareness month in September 2021 for my first Pharmacy Awareness event. Since many students were locked down in Victoria and New South Wales at that time, this event was created as a health promotion so that all branches could participate equally.

The emphasis on vaccine-preventable diseases was selected to raise awareness of the remarkable positive health outcomes that have resulted from their development and implementation in societies all over the world.

The following posts were made:

3rd September: The importance of influenza vaccination

10th September: The importance of Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B vaccination 17th September: The importance of Human Papillomavirus vaccination

24th September: The importance of Measles vaccination 30th September: The importance of COVID19 vaccination

I also received my COVID19 Pfizer vaccine during Vaccine Awareness Month, so this was posted on NAPSA social media pages, and I believe it was an excellent opportunity for me to promote vaccines and demonstrate the importance of having vaccines on time.

# BENEFITS OF VACCINATION

COVID-19 will be with us for many years into the future.

Getting vaccinated now has many benefits, including:

- protecting yourself against severe illness and death from COVID-19
- preventing complications such as 'long
- protecting people who can't be vaccinated due to medical conditions
- protecting children while research continues to test the safety of COVID-19 vaccines in people under the age of 12

# SO, SHOULD I GET THE FLU VACCINE?

Yes, while the vaccine is not 100% effective, it provides a high level of protection and can help those who are still sick. Because the vaccine may not always protect against all strains of the flu virus circulating in the community, some people may still catch the flu.

Other pharmacy awareness chairs from various branches collaborated, including Vicki and Mei-lee from TEPSA and Michelle Ngo from GUAPS, who went above and beyond to create such high quality content in a short period of time, which certainly helped to broaden the understanding and importance of different vaccines available in Australia.

This initiative has unquestionably increased community awareness of vaccines available in pharmacies, so thank you all for your efforts.

The data were obtained from reliable sources including the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), Better Health VIC, Health Direct Government, Australian Immunisation Handbook, NSW Government, Australian Government Department of Health, and Cancer Council Organisation.

# GREAT MINDS DON'T THINK ALIKE!

Teamwork makes the dream work – but sometimes that 'team' is spread beyond people we work closely with, or even people we know.

To make the smartest decisions, it's important to gather as much current information as possible, which is where *Pharmacy Forecast Australia* steps in as a new annual report helping shape future pharmacy planning. It is the extra and all-knowing team member future pharmacy leaders can turn to!

While one person, one team, or one health service can continue to build on local successes, there is greater power in infusing the strategic planning process with a snapshot of what other minds across the profession are thinking, at that same moment in time.

It is with this broad remit in mind that SHPA brought Pharmacy Forecast to Australia.



### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW, NOW

Pharmacy Forecast Australia 2021 was inspired by the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP's) Pharmacy Forecast, which is now a much-anticipated annual publication used by the pharmacy practice sector to plan for future demand, service provision and leadership.

SHPA's inaugural Forecast was developed using the same 'wisdom of crowds' methodology, which identified six key emerging trends and phenomena projected to impact pharmacy practice and the health of Australian patients to 2026, contextualised into the following recommendations by the report's 19 authors.



# EMERGING TRENDS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUTURE PHARMACY LEADERS



#### WORKFORCE OF THE FUTURE

- · identify barriers to successfully implementation of collaborative prescribing
- facilitate education and training that fosters leadership competency
- · undertake gap analysis to the implementation of pharmacy residencies
- support skilled workforce capacity through promotion of hospital pharmacy career pathways
- invest in hospital pharmacy technicians' ongoing professional development.



#### WORKFORCE ACCESS / RESOURCING

- resource/advocate for specialised clinical services; 7-day pharmacy services and roles in non-hospital settings
- advocate for increased pharmacy informatics roles that harness smart technology to inform safe systems
- integrate electronic health records into business-as-usual practices
- consider pharmacy design and models of care that incorporates automated technologies, in faculty and service planning
- · advocate for expanded pharmacy technician roles at all levels.



#### RELIABILITY OF MEDICINES SUPPLY

- support advocacy for improved, centralised early warning systems for medication shortages
- · develop and advocate a Purchasing Standards Policy
- · unite behind robust pharmacy procurement standards.



#### MEDICATION COMPLEXITY AND ACCESS

- ensure procurement frameworks safeguard quality use of medicines and measure value delivered from pharmacy resources
- actively participate in discussions around policies and funding reforms that increase medicines access and equity
- lead the transition to biological and biosimilars by developing clear education and management processes
- lead the development of a 'patient first' attitude so that dispensing and ambulatory care services are adapted to improve patient access to complex medicines.



#### MEDICATION SAFETY

- implement workforce planning and training for leadership roles in medication safety
- lead workforce redesign for medication reconciliation and management during high-risk transitions of care
- · build capacity in clinical informatics to inform safe systems.



#### ELECTRONIC REVOLUTION

- invest in training in digital technologies and solutions to address workforce and health issues
- actively follow developments in EMM systems and advocate for their adoption and expansion
- advocate, in partnership with strong nursing leadership, for the implementation of automated dispensing cabinets
- advocate for closed loop medication management systems
- increase the prevalence, safety and effectiveness of pharmacy telehealth services
- advocate for MHR adoption by patients and organisations to ensure accurate information sharing.





#### Rural Pharmacy Scholarship Scheme:

The Rural Pharmacy Scholarship Scheme provides financial support to students from rural and remote communities to undertake undergraduate or postgraduate studies in pharmacy at university.

# Each year, at least 30 scholarships are made available, each with a value of \$10,000 (GST exempt) per year per student.

Scholarship holders are encouraged to seek employment in rural and remote areas following graduation.

This is a great way to get a head start on your tertiary Pharmacy degree and could one day see you delivering pharmacy services to a rural or regional community where you will become a valued member of a community.

#### Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Pharmacy Scholarship Scheme

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Pharmacy Scholarship Scheme (ATSIPSS) aims to address the health needs of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community and the workforce needs of the pharmacy profession by encouraging Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to choose a career in pharmacy. The Scheme supports students who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander in their decision to undertake undergraduate or graduate entry studies in pharmacy at an Australian university.

# At least three scholarships are offered each year, with a value of \$15,000 (GST exempt) per student, per year.

Successful applicants will receive the scholarship for a maximum of four years or until the end of their course of study, whichever is shorter. Scholarship holders may be granted a maximum of \$60,000 over a four-year period.

This is a great way to reach your tertiary goals and in future you may choose to provide specialised pharmacy services to aboriginal people in a local community.

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
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
